\*please note the fire danger rating may change throughout the day. Prior to burning find out the danger rating in your area.

<b>LOW</b>	<i>...Fires do not readily start and those that do start spread slowly and are easier to control.</i>
<b>MODERATE</b>	<i>...Forest fuels are drying and there is an increased risk of surface fires starting. Carry out any forest activities with caution.</i>
<b>HIGH</b>	<i>...Forest fuels are very dry and fire risk is serious. New fires may start easily, burn vigorously, and challenge fire suppression efforts. Caution must be used in any forest activities.</i>
<b>EXTREME</b>	<i>...Forest fuels are extremely dry and fire risk is very serious. Fires may start easily, spread rapidly, and challenge fire suppression efforts. Extreme caution must be used in any forest activities.</i>

**NEW FIRE ACTIVITY:** No new fires were reported Thursday. The danger rating in Whitehorse is Extreme due to strong winds, we encourage the public to take precautions as strong winds can cause a small fire to spread quickly. A total of 38 firefighters and 4 incident management staff as well as 50 pumps remain in B.C.

**CAMPFIRE AND BURNING RESTRICTIONS:** Campfires permitted outside of Whitehorse city limits. Public is reminded that burning permits are mandatory for any burning of brush, grass or debris. This also applies to burning with a burn barrel or lighting an open fire for any other purpose than a campfire. Permits are free and available at your local fire district or Energy Mines and Resources office depending on your region. **\*burning permits are suspended or no longer issued when danger rating is moderate, high or extreme**

**WEATHER FORECAST:** Cloudy and damp weather expected in Mayo, Carmacks, Faro, and Ross River. Some early showers are expected in Beaver Creek and Burwash, while some afternoon showers are expected in Watson Lake, with a low chance of lightning in most of these areas. Temperatures are not expected to exceed the mid-teens throughout the Territory. Brisk winds are expected to once again develop over the southern sections of the Territory, with sustained winds in the 20's.
